



Sweet Deal for Husbands

Birmingham lift company Husbands has won a contract to supply a 2,000 kg goods lift to Rowse Honey – the UK's largest honey processor. The lift installation is part of a £2m expansion programme at the company's plant in Wallingford, Oxfordshire.

In addition, the Halesowen based company has been awarded another two contracts by KFC to provide service lifts to its restaurants in Shrewsbury and Paddington. This brings the total of lifts fitted for this chain over the last two years up to 20 and brings the value of the contract up to more than £100,000.

Husbands engineers took out a lift in the Shrewsbury KFC outlet which the company had fitted 30 years ago and replaced it with a new 50 kg Balmatic service lift. In Paddington a 250 kg service lift was fitted serving the basement to the ground floor.
